This non-qualifying competition is sanctioned by U. S. Figure Skating (USFS) and is open to all qualified eligible skaters who are current members in good standing with the USFS and Basic Skills Members. The competition will be governed by the rules of the USFS as specified in the 2010 USFS Rule Book. Program requirements at all levels will be according to the 2010 USFS Rule Book, however any rule changes marked as "Urgent" at the May 2010 Governing Council will apply. The purpose of this competition is to provide a fun competitive experience in figure skating for both youth and adults.

ENTRIES: Entries must be submitted on the official Entry Form applicable for either individual events or team events. An "Accidents & Liability and Certification by Club Officer" form for **every** participant must be included with the application to be considered complete and on time. The entry and certification form may be duplicated. Please note this is a large competition; we strongly urge you to register early. Please mail all forms via U.S. standard postal service to:

FEES: IJS Events - First Event - \$115.00; Each Additional IJS event \$75.00.
6.0 Events - First Event - \$75.00; Each Additional Event - \$40.00 per event; Group Event - \$40.00 per skater.
Basic Skills Events - \$40.00 per event.
Payment must be included with application, in the form of check or money order payable to Hershey Figure Skating Club. All checks returned for nonsufficient funds are subject to a \$30.00 reprocessing fee. The entry fee plus the \$30.00 must be paid in cash or money order before the skater will be allowed to compete.

EVENT CHANGE FEE: Please review your application closely with your coach to ensure you have entered the correct events/levels. After the tentative schedule is posted any change in your registration because of an error in your application will result in a \$25.00 fee per change.

LATE ENTRIES: Entry forms postmarked after the deadline date will be considered late entries and will only be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee. Late entries must include the late fee of \$50.00 to be considered. If a late entry is accepted, please note that you will receive the schedule and practice ice application at a later date than those who registered by the deadline.

ACCIDENTS & REFUNDS: As per Rule #3235 of the USFS Rulebook, once entries have closed, entry fees are only refundable if the competition is not held.

TEST & AGE: Age as of the June 11, 2010 (Entry Deadline).

JUDGING SYSTEM: The IJS System will be used for all short programs and Juvenile through Senior Freeskating (except Open Juvenile). All other events will be judged using the 6.0 system.

REGISTRATION & ADMISSION: The registration table will open each day, one hour prior to the first event of the day and will remain open throughout each day of the competition. Competitors need only register for their first event promptly upon arrival. No admission fee will be charged for spectators.

- RINK:** The Competition will be held at **Hersheypark Arena** 100 W. Hersheypark Drive, Hershey, PA 17033 (**not Giant Center**). The ice measures 200 feet by 85 feet, with rounded corners and a barrier. A snack bar will be open during the competition.
- LOCKER RMS:** Locker rooms will be available for both male and female competitors.
- MUSIC:** CD's or Mini Discs are required. CD's or Mini Disc must be labeled CLEARLY with competitor's name, event, and side to be played. All music media must contain only one program per media submitted. Music must be turned in at the CD/RESULT DESK one hour before the event. Competitors **MUST HAVE DUPLICATE CD/MINI DISC** with them. Music must be picked up at the CD/RESULT DESK by the end of the day. The HFSC assumes NO responsibility for unclaimed music by the end of the competition.
- SCHEDULE:** **Specific schedule WILL NOT be available prior to July 16th. Please no phone inquiries.** A copy of the tentative schedule, the practice ice schedule, parking passes, and directions will be posted on the Hershey FSC website at **www.hersheyfigureskating.org**. Group assignments will be emailed to individual competitors.
- PRACTICE ICE:** The practice ice schedule will be available online at **www.hersheyfigureskating.org** when the tentative schedule is posted. To ensure the best availability of practice ice time be sure to mail in your practice ice request form promptly. No telephone requests or reservations will be accepted.
- AWARDS:** Medals will be awarded to all first, second, third and fourth place finishers in each event. A trophy and medal will be awarded to the first place finisher for final round events and second, third and fourth place finishers will receive a medal. Ribbons will awarded to first, second, third, and fourth place finishers in Manuever Team events.
- FINAL ROUND:** For each single free skating event (except for Beginner and Tots) made up of more than one group, an equal number of place finishers not to exceed the top 3, will advance to a final round. Final Round will consist of no more than 12 skaters.

- PARKING:** **VERY IMPORTANT!** The entrance for the Ice Rink at Hersheypark Arena is also used for Hersheypark, Hershey's Chocolate World, and other attractions. The complex includes many very large parking lots for guests of the amusement park, and are a **20+ minute walk** to the Arena. Parking for Hershey Open attendees is directly in front of the Arena, but you **MUST** present a Hershey Open parking pass to the parking staff. These parking passes will be posted on the club website, www.hersheyfigureskating.org. **Please be sure to print and bring your parking pass with you, or you will be charged for parking.**

FREE SKATING EVENTS

Skaters may enter only one level. Skaters may skate up one test level. If you won your level last year, you must move up to the next level, except Senior. Short and long programs are separate events.

Skaters may enter only one level. Skaters may skate up one test level.

All short programs will be conducted according to the required elements for the 2010 competition season.

INDIVIDUAL COMPULSORY ELEMENTS

Skating is done on half the ice surface in the categories of No-Test, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, and Pre-Juvenile. Full ice surface will be utilized for Juvenile. No music will be utilized for this event. **Required elements may be skated in any order.** Additional jumps or spins are not permitted and will result in deductions if included. For this event, male skaters may be placed in with female skaters depending on the entry numbers.

THAT'S ENTERTAINMENT SOLO & GROUP EVENTS

This is a program with the emphasis on the Entertainment value, rather than technical content. Elements to be considered in judging will be illustration of character, music interpretation, costuming, and audience appeal. Vocal music is allowed. Test Requirements are the same as for the Free Skate. Skaters may skate up one Test Level. Props are optional. Skaters must carry their own props on and off the ice. **PLEASE NOTE: You will not be able to drive to the back of the Arena to drop off the props. They must be carried down the stairs to the ice surface.** For this event, male skaters may be placed in with female skaters depending on the entry numbers.

IMPROV EVENTS

A program choreographed by the competitor, unassisted, to music supplied by the organizers. The music will be played twice during a warm-up on ice and once for each competitor off-ice prior to skating, but will NOT be heard by the skaters prior to the warm-up. All competitors in the group will interpret the same music. Skaters will be judged on originality, musical and artistic expression and ice coverage. No costumes or props allowed. Male and female skaters may be combined for this event.

SPINS EVENT

Test requirements are the same as listed for Free Skate. Skaters may skate up one level. The listed spins must be performed in a program without music and in any order with connecting steps necessary to link the various spins together. Only spins are judged. All levels will be on 1/2 the ice surface. Male skaters maybe placed with female skaters for this event.

Skaters may enter at their last-passed level only, as of the closing date of entries. The judge in charge will ask the skater to skater each skill. Skaters will use one-third to one-half of the ice surface. No music. Time 1:00 minute or less.
